Notes:

- (1) This is the most famous place that is a must for all tourists. The Grand Palace and the Temple of the Emerald Buddha were built after King Rama I ascended the throne as the founder of the Chakri Dynasty on 6 April 1782 and have undergone several repairs and renovations.
- (2) Wat Pho, the official name being Wat Phra Chetuphon Vimolmangklararm Rajwaramahaviharn, is the first grade royal monastery, regarded as the most important one during the reign of King Rama I of the Chakri Dynasty.
- (3) Museum Siam is a museum that uses interactive storytelling with seven characters as intermediates. The museum shows the development of Thailand from the past to present.
- (4) Samut Songkhram Province where is located at the mouth of the Mae Klong river to the Gulf of Thailand.
- (5) Amphawa-Chaipattananurak Conservation Project is a center of collaboration to conserve and develop Thai traditions on which the Amphawa residents have had pride themselves.
- (6) Amphawa Floating Market where is a large floating market and a community center on commercial waterfront.
- (7) Maruekhathaiyawan Palace is the summer seaside palace where was built in 1923 under the royal command of King Rama VI using golden teakwood from the demolished Hat Chao Samran Palace.
- (8) Sirindhorn International Environmental Park is an international learning centre in global energy, natural resources and the environment. It provides comprehensive range of learning activities, creates innovation that link science and technology both in the country and abroad with local knowledge for sustainable development.
- (9) "Chang Hua Mun" royal initiative project purposes are to develop and support the agricultural careers for the local people in Petchaburi and their ability and success in sustainable livelihood of themselves and their families.



Qualifications and Registration Requirements

1. An applicant must be an undergraduate student studying in the third year or fourth year or a graduate student.
2. An applicant must submit verification of undergraduate or graduate study including the most recent official transcript and a confirmation letter from your institute.
3. An applicant must submit Curriculum Vitae
4. An applicant must submit an essay -minimum 1,000 words- on the topic below:
“Strategies and Challenges for implementing sufficient economy for sustainable development in your country”
5. An applicant must be able to speak English.
6. An applicant must be in good health with no infectious or contagious disease.
7. An applicant must prepare a national costume for a performance at a reception Party.
8. Deadline for application submission is March 7, 2015.

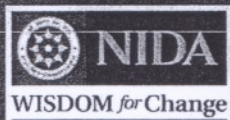


Highlight of the 4th NIDA Summer Camp
